## Park Update

It's hard to believe another year is about to come to a conclusion. We had another very busy and successful year at the park. Plentiful snowfall last season resulted in an increased number of snowshoers, winter hikers, and skiers, and great weather in the spring and summer contributed to substantial increases in park visitors and revenue. Compared to 2008, overall visitation increased by 11% to 186,000 and overnight camping by 17% to 32,000. As a result of increased visitation, park revenues also increased by 6% from 2008. It pleases me to see, despite a poor economy, people still value and set-aside time to visit and experience places such as Wild River State Park.

As many of you are aware, long-time park naturalist Dave Crawford retired this past October. Dave began his career with the DNR in 1976 and had worked at Wild River since 1990. Besides providing interpretive programming and services to thousands of park visitors and school groups over the years, Dave was also very active in the park's resource management program. 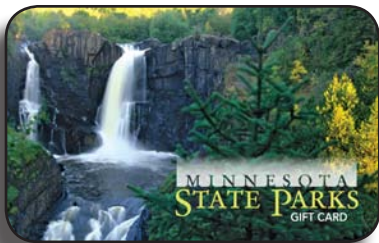

development of service learning programs called Prairie Care and Species Stewards, hundreds of acres of oak savannah and prairie have been restored at the park utilizing school groups and citizen volunteers. Dave's lasting contributions to the park can not be understated. Even though Dave has retired; don't be surprised if you see him at the park as he has officially signed up as a volunteer. At this time, due to hiring restrictions resulting from the state budget shortfall, we are unable to move forward with hiring a successor to Dave. Until we are able to hire a new naturalist, we will rely on volunteers to help us maintain some Visitor Center hours and offer some limited programming.

In November, the park conducted another successful managed deer hunt. About 160 hunters participated in a four day hunt which resulted in a harvest of 113 deer. The goal of park deer hunts is to reduce the deer population to a level which results in less damage to park vegetation caused by over-browsing. This year's hunt marked the final year of a five-year study to evaluate the effectiveness of alternative hunting regulations to reduce deer populations. The alternative regulation which was studied at the park was called an earn-a-buck hunt which required hunters to harvest an antlerless deer prior to taking an antlered deer. This type of hunt favored the harvest of female deer which should reduce the breeding and overall population of deer in the park. To help us make decisions about future deer hunts in the park we will analyze the data collected over the five-year earn-a-buck study period and also conduct an aerial deer population survey this winter.



If you're looking for a great gift idea, may I suggest the purchase of the just recently introduced new State Park Gift Card. These new gift cards can be purchased for any amount over \$10 and can be used for camping, lodging, and vehicle permits, as well as clothing, books, and other items sold at Minnesota State Parks. The gift card is a great way to introduce people to state parks and all the great scenic and recreational opportunities that await them.

# WR Youth Nordic Ski Club to begin fourth season

2010 will be Wild River Youth Nordic Ski Club's fourth year at Wild River State Park. The WRYNSC brings the joy of cross-country skiing to local youth.

The Minnesota Youth Ski League provides a structured 8-week curriculum at six different ski levels to clubs. Groups of skiers ages 4-14 will meet at the Trail Center on Sundays between 2 and 4pm. Park staff hopes to groom several special areas around the Horse

Camp to accommodate up to 40 young skiers and their coaches.

The club is organized by a volunteer coordinator and volunteer coaches. The club leader welcomes help with snacks, drinks, assisting group coaches, and even being a group coach (several spots are available!). Group coaches need to make a commitment to eight Sunday afternoons, understand the fundamentals of skiing, and have fun! Volunteers do not need to be an experts,
