State Park Update

It's hard to believe yet another year has come to pass and it is time again to embark on a journey into a new year. However, before we begin the new year, I'd like to share with you some of the highlights from this past year.

- For the fourth consecutive year, both attendance and revenue increased over the previous year. Although the attendance numbers are not final yet, I am estimating that total park attendance will approach 200,000 visitors. The concessionaires operating the ski and canoe rentals both reported having one of their best years on record and increased revenue compared to 2009.

- Through funding derived from the Clean Water, Land, and Legacy Amendment, the park completed prairie restoration work on over 180 acres of old field north and west of the equestrian campground. Improvements were also made to significant portions of the park's hiking trails to reduce erosion and provide a better surface for hiking, skiing, and horseback riding. Numerous energy conservation improvements were also made to buildings throughout the park. In addition, funds from the Clean Water Land and Legacy account also made it possible to hire three Minnesota Naturalist Corp staff which provided increased interpretive services between Memorial and Labor Day.

- In the fall of this past year, work was

completed on a project to add electrical hook-ups to 15 campsites in the equestrian campground.

- Prescribed burns were conducted on approximately 240 acres of oak woodland and prairie. It is my understanding that the total acres burned this past year represents the largest number of acres burned in any one year.

- In April, we welcomed Kacie Carlson to the park as the new naturalist. As we've all learned, Kacie has demonstrated a can-do attitude and brought to her job a seemingly never ending supply of enthusiasm, energy, and new ideas. During her short time here, Kacie has introduced a variety of new interpretive programs, strengthened and expanded partnerships with other agencies, and broadened and increased outreach efforts to attract new visitors to the park. Kacie has been a great addition to the park staff and we look forward to many more years of continued outstanding service.

Finally, as you may be aware, Shawn Donais, the park's assistant manager has accepted an appointment as the assistant manager at Gooseberry Falls State Park. We are happy for Shawn and Kia as they are able to realize their dream of living and working on the beautiful North Shore of Lake Superior. Over the years, many of you have had the pleasure of getting to know Shawn and his wife Kia through their countless hours of volunteering with the Friends Group on activities such as the Candlelight Ski, Seegwan, board meetings, the newsletter publication, and much more. I also have had the pleasure of working with Shawn and witnessed first-hand his dedication and commitment to improving the park and providing a better experience for all visitors. Without a doubt the park is a better place because of his service. Please join me in thanking Shawn for being an exceptional steward of the park for the past 10-plus years.

Naturalist Notes

Greetings, Friends! Amongst the hustle and bustle of the holidays, we have much to celebrate at Wild River State Park. This year, over 200,000 visitors enjoyed the variety of activities and beautiful resources here. With the help of three Naturalist Corps staff, the Interpretive program was able to reach out to over 9,000 of those visitors in over 245 educational programs. Highlights from the summer include participating in Seegwan and the Chisago County Fair, the addition of 'side-walk-stop' programming, seining activities, and digital photography classes, the development of the Butterflies of Wild River State Park book and a family-friendly geocache puzzle, and enhanced cooperation between the North Branch and Chisago County Community Education programs. It is the Division of Parks and Trails vision to "create unforgettable park, trail, and water recreation experiences that inspire people to pass along the love for the outdoors to current and future generations", and with your support we continue to do just that.

As founded by Dave Crawford in 1993, the Prairie Care program maintained flawlessly throughout the transition of Naturalist staff. With the warm, wet weather, the prairies were taller and thicker than ever before. Volunteers came from all over to provide 2,315 hours of seed collecting, sowing, and monitoring. A total value of \$34,987 worth of seed was collected to enhance the parks 450 acres of current prairie restoration efforts. An additional 974 volunteer hours were committed to hosting the Visitor Center, buckthorn removal, trail and facility up-keep, and various wildlife surveys.

We also continue to be thankful for all that you, the Friends of Wild River State Park, do for us each year. With money



raised through the Pancake Breakfast, grants, donations, and membership fees, 11 guest presenters were funded which drew an interest of 766 participants. Countless smiles, laughs, and memories were made as visitors enjoyed acoustic entertainment with Charlie McGuire, live frogs with Randy Korb, blacksmithing with Paul Webster, flint knapping with Joel Osmond, story-telling with Dwight Wilcox, star-gazing with Steve Tonsfeldt, and music and dancing with

Pierre Jacques Pleau. 57 individuals also checked books out from the Barb Nelson Memorial Library, a truckload of garbage was removed from the St. Croix River during the Friends-hosted canoe cleanup event, and two Naturalist Corps staff were extended to assist with the Prairie Care program and in designing new interpretive exhibits for the Visitor Center lobby
